
## **Prologue**

### 1893: Swami Vivekananda at Chicago

We all know of Swami Vivekananda's extraordinary debut at the Parliament of Religions with his famous beginning, "Sisters and Brothers of America", and the phenomenal response he received from the eclectic global audience to the six key talks he gave. The success at the Parliament made Swami Vivekananda, till then an unknown monk from India, into a world figure.

For the period between May 1893 and December 1896, Swami Vivekananda gave several lectures across America and Europe seeding the powerful ideas of Vedanta and the Upanishads in the Western world. During this period he also interacted with some of the finest minds of the West.



### 1897: A Triumphant Return

Swami Vivekananda returned to India in 1897, where he was accorded a hero's welcome.

Thousands turned up to see this new type of hero – one who conquered not with weapons but with lofty ideas and ideals.




He received a touching welcome from the Raja of Ramnad.

The horses were unhitched from the carriage bearing the Swami, and the people themselves, the Raja among them, drew it.

At Rameswaram the Raja erected, in the Swami's honour, a victory column forty feet high with a suitable inscription.

He was also given a triumphant reception in Kolkata (Original Photograph - February 28, 1897)



### **Awakening the Nation**

Swami Vivekananda gave a series of 29 stirring lectures across the length and breadth of the country, awakening the nation. His goal was to stir India out of its centuries of slumber, regain faith in itself and its vast heritage, and organise itself for the task of rebuilding a nation broken after ten centuries of foreign invasion, Islamic conquest, and European colonisation.

His speeches were not mere eloquence. They represented the revelation of a vision for India and a profound articulation of both challenges and solutions to the nation's apparently insurmountable problems. These lectures inspired hundreds of freedom fighters and patriots to dedicate their lives to this nation.

The speech at Ramnad, the 5<sup>th</sup> he made, carried in essence, his prophetic vision for the nation.

"The longest night seems to be passing away, the sorest trouble seems to be coming to an end at last:

the seeming corpse appears to be awaking and a voice is coming to us... she is awakening, this motherland of ours, from her deep long sleep...

None can resist her any more; never is she going to sleep any more; no outward powers can hold her back any more;


for the infinite giant is rising to her feet."
